- Stock out and maintaining drug supplies

Constraints: Financial

- Percentage of budget in countries like South Africa and Nigeria
- Donor dependence in Malawi and Mozambique
- Long-term commitments and sustainability

Constraints: Political

- Issues of equity:
 - ART \$150 pppy
 - Government Health Expenditure +/- \$20 pppy
- Lack of voice
- Retrogressive attitudes to IDUs and MSM
