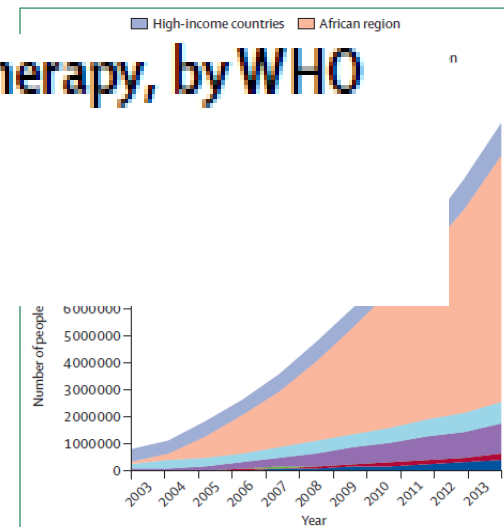
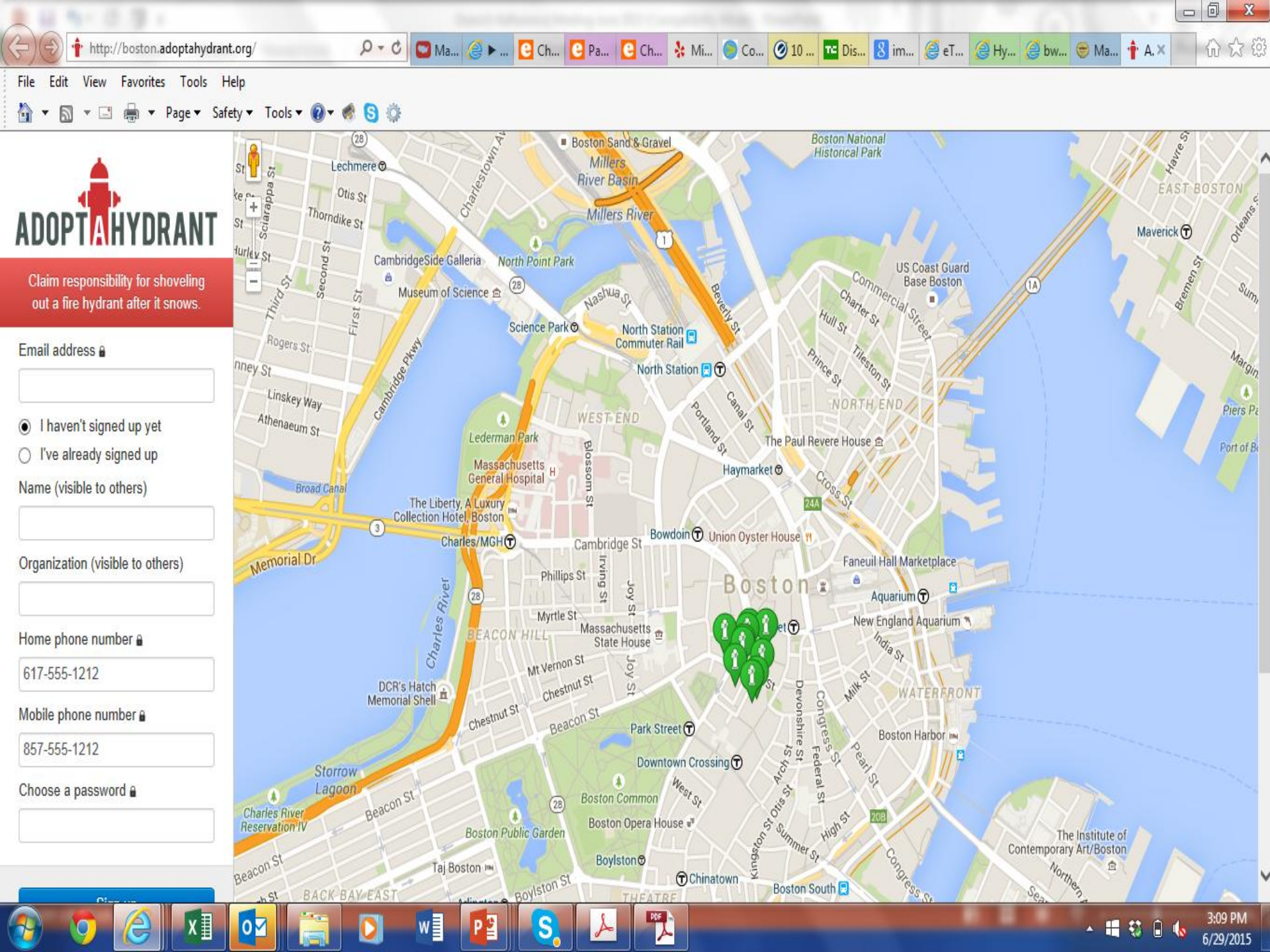


Figure 2: Number of people receiving antiretroviral therapy, by WHO region, 2003–13

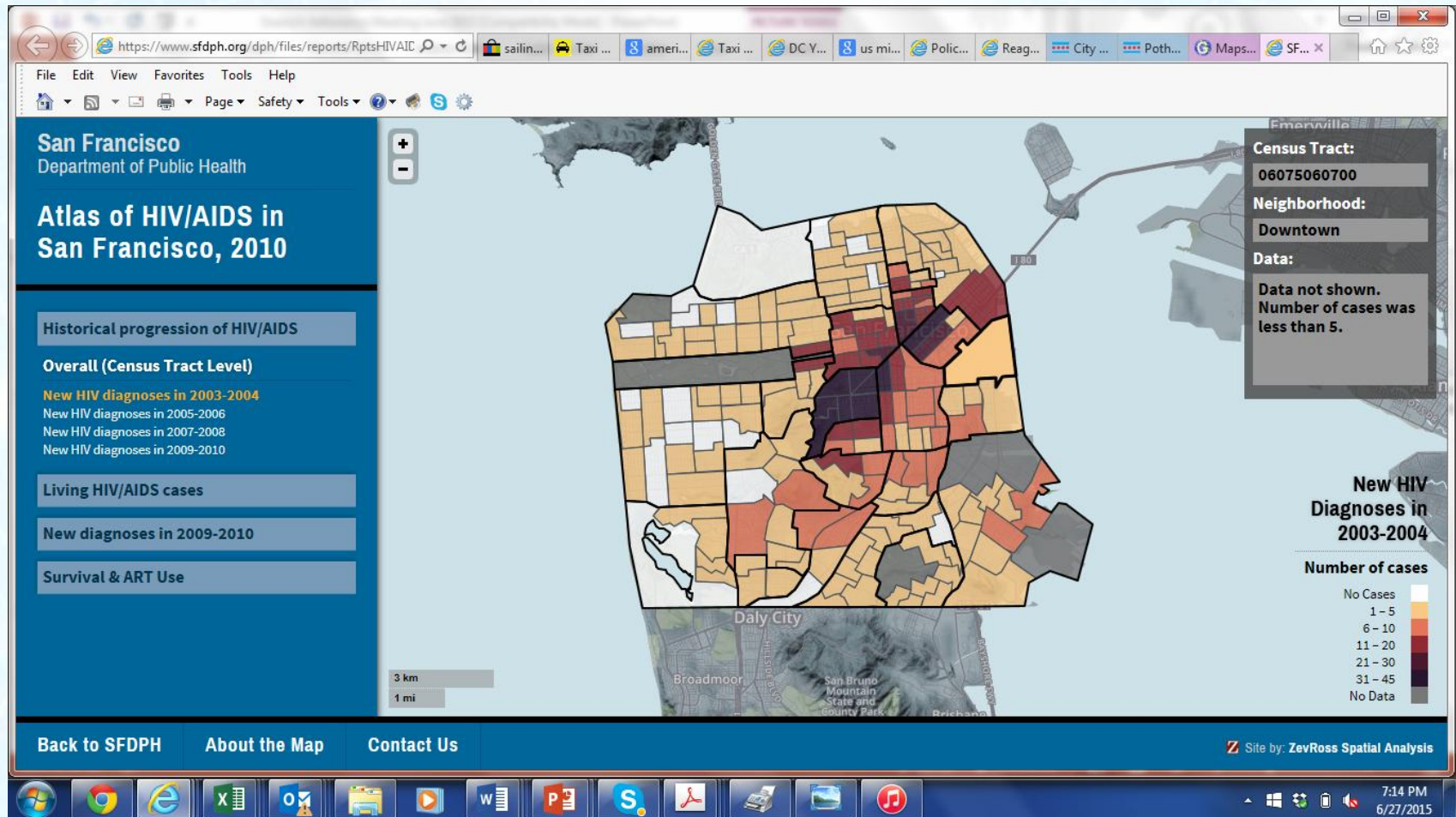

PARIS DECLARATION, 1 December 2014 - On the eve of AIDS Day 2014, mayors from around the world came together in Paris, France, to sign a declaration to end the AIDS epidemic in their cities. In signing the Paris Declaration, the mayors committed to putting cities on the Fast Track to ending the AIDS epidemic through a set of commitments. These commitments include addressing the 90-90-90 targets, which will ensure 90% of people living with HIV know their status, 90% of people who know their status are taking antiretroviral treatment and 90% of people on treatment with suppressed viral loads, keeping them healthy and reducing the risk of HIV transmission.

"Ending the AIDS epidemic is achievable if the world's major cities act immediately and decisively to fast-track their AIDS responses by 2020," said the Hon. Laurentina Chirwa, Minister of Health, Malawi, and Co-Chair of the Paris Declaration. "We must also encourage new, cutting-edge science, address inequalities that continue to drive the epidemic, and ensure people have the support, including education, social and reproductive health, and mental health, to live healthy and meaningful lives."

At the World AIDS Conference Paris, including the Mayor of Paris, Anne Hidalgo, the mayors gathered and signed the Paris Declaration on Ending the AIDS epidemic in their cities. The Paris Declaration is a commitment to ending the AIDS epidemic by 2020. 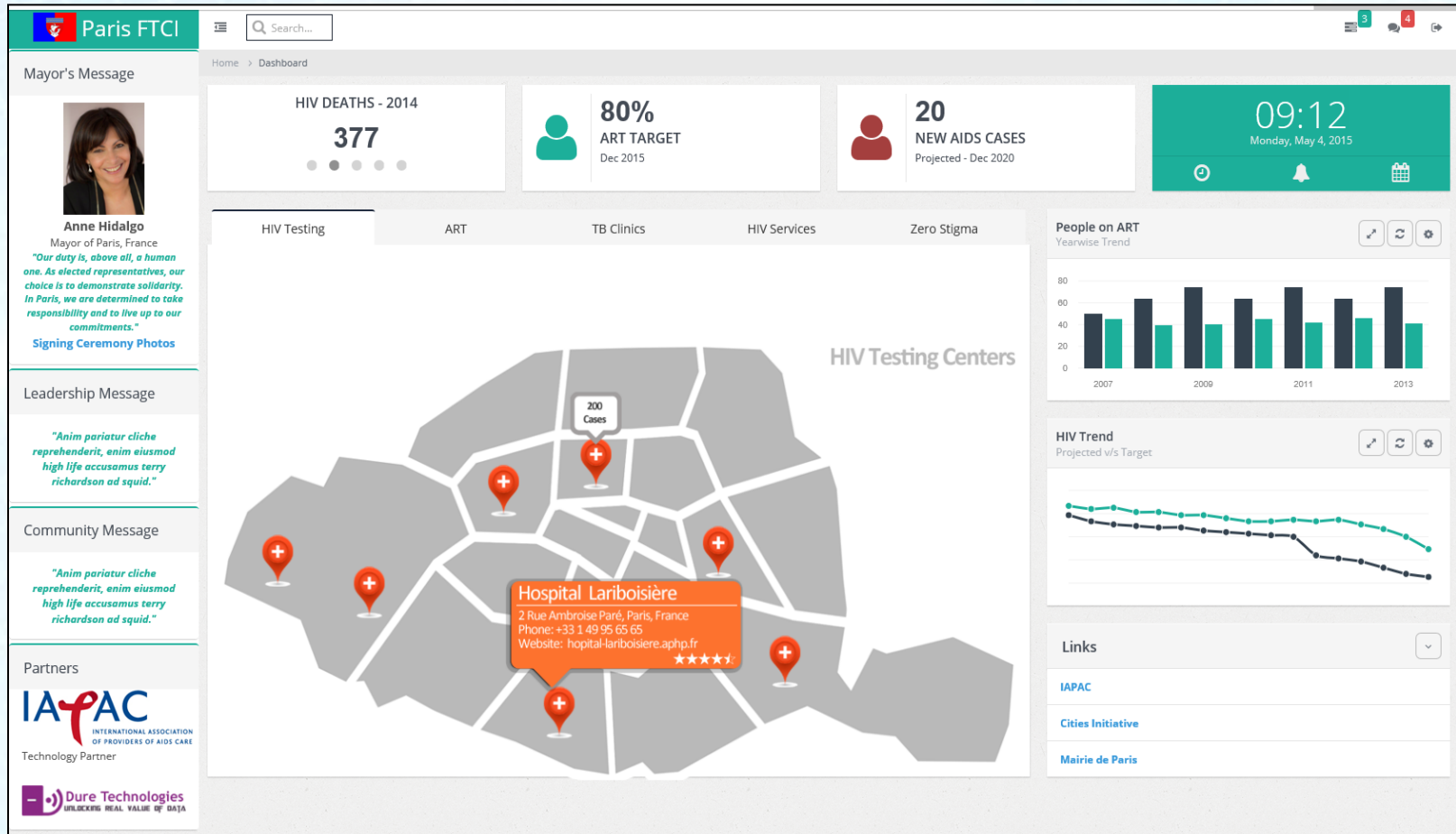
The FAST-TRACK Cities Initiative

Ending the AIDS epidemic by 2030 is feasible if the world's major cities act immediately and decisively to Fast-Track their AIDS responses by 2020. Success will rely upon cities frontloading investments and stepping up the pace of delivering HIV services, especially the roll-out of antiretroviral therapy. That is why, on World AIDS Day 2014, mayors and other city leaders from around the world joined with representatives of civil society and international organizations to launch the Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities, pledging to achieve the 90-90-90 targets by 2020. As part of the FTCI, we will work together to ensure that 90% of people living with HIV know their status, 90% of who know their status on treatment and 90% on treatment with suppressed viral load.

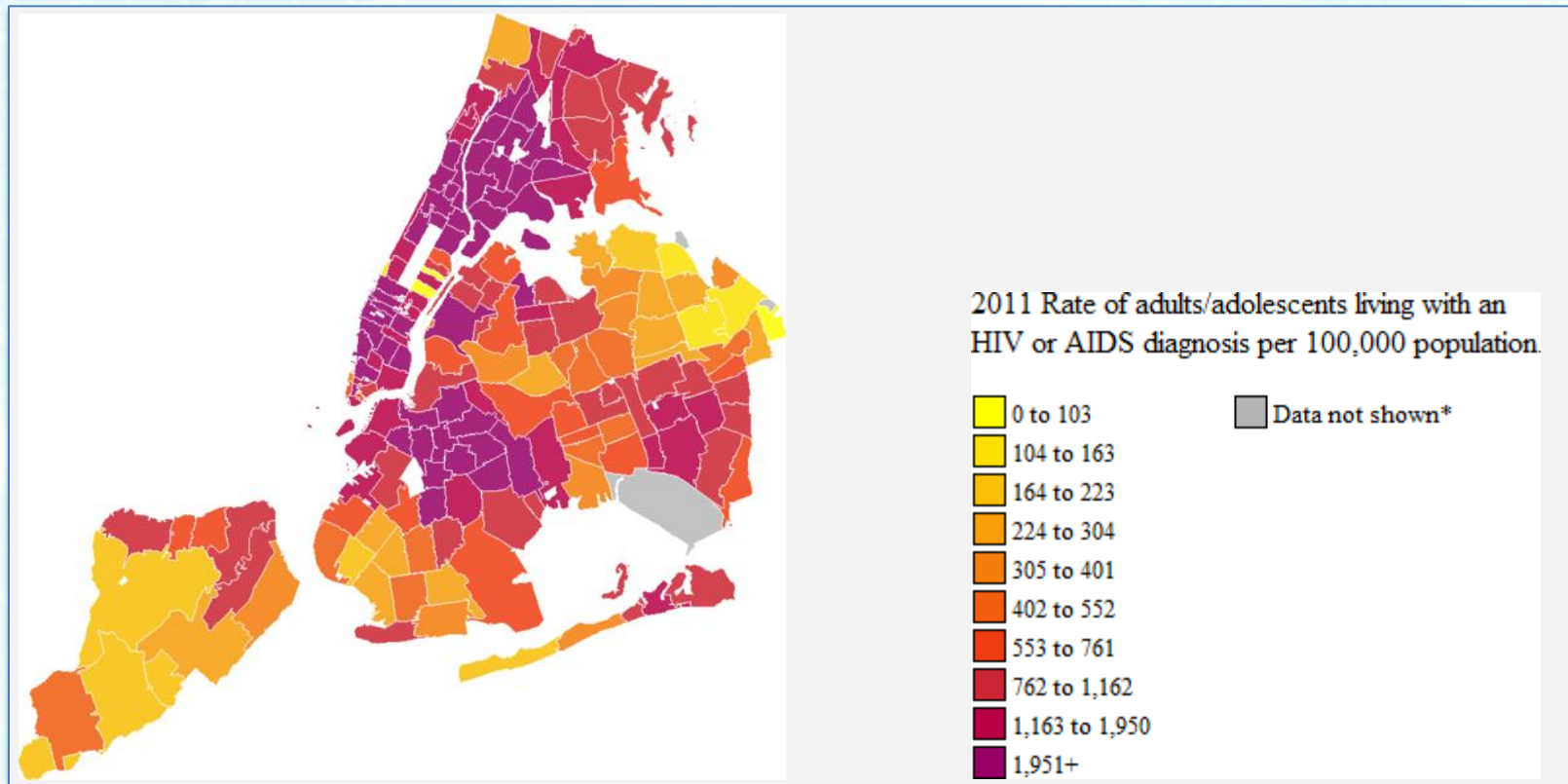
