FINDING HIV CARE AND TREATMENT

- Find HIV care services near you: Find local HIV medical care, housing assistance, and substance abuse and mental health services.
- <u>Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA): State HIV/AIDS Hotlines:</u> Connect with agencies that can help determine what services you are eligible for and help you get them.
- Find HIV healthcare providers
- Locate <u>Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program</u> providers who can help you access the medical care, medications, and essential support services you need.
- <u>Search for HIV care specialists:</u> Find HIV providers who are members of the American Academy of HIV Medicine.

PAYING FOR HIV CARE AND TREATMENT

- Find out if you're eligible for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program: If you do not have health insurance or money to pay for health services, you might qualify for medical care and other essential support services.
- See if you qualify for disability benefits: If you are unable to work because of HIV or AIDS, you
 may be eligible for disability benefits from the Social Security Administration (SSA).
- <u>Estimate the cost of health coverage:</u> Use online cost calculators to help you understand options for lowering the cost of health insurance.
- Find out how to get Medicare drug coverage: If you have Medicare, learn about what the drug plans cover and the costs you'll pay.
- <u>Get affordable health insurance:</u> See if you can enroll in or change plans and get answers to common questions.

- <u>Learn about the Affordable Care Act (ACA)</u>: The ACA created several changes that expand access to coverage for people with HIV.
- <u>Learn about Patient Assistance and Expanded Access Programs:</u> Find prescription drug assistance information and learn about current expanded access trials.

HOUSING AND JOB RESOURCES

- <u>Learn about the Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) Program:</u> HOPWA is the only Federal program dedicated to addressing the housing needs of people with HIV.
- Find affordable housing opportunities: If you are homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, or know someone who is, you might be eligible for housing assistance.
- Find questions and answers about housing assistance: Learn about housing programs that are available for people with HIV and their eligibility requirements.
- <u>Get advice on getting a new job or returning to work:</u> Find out how to return to work and learn about your right to request reasonable accommodations.
- Find resources on employment options for people with HIV: View toolkits, read success stories, and find resource guides for entering or returning the workforce.

LEGAL ISSUES

- <u>Find states that have HIV-specific criminal laws:</u> Get details on each state's HIV-related laws, guidelines for healthcare workers, and testing and treatment information from the <u>The Center for HIV Law & Policy</u>.
- Get information about HIV discrimination: Learn about how the Americans with Disabilities Act
 (ADA) protects people who are discriminated against because they have HIV or have a
 relationship with someone with HIV.
- File an HIV discrimination complaint: File an ADA complaint related to HIV discrimination in employment or housing.
- Get information about your rights related to healthcare access and health insurance

MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT

- Find mental health treatment programs: View a list of organizations and contact numbers that can help you find mental health treatment and support in your local area.
- Learn about depression: Get information about depression's causes, symptoms, and treatments.
