



## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### Initial Survey Data Provide Insights into Quality of Life of People Living with HIV

The [Fast-Track Cities Quality of Life Survey](#) was developed by the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC), in partnership with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), the Global Network for People Living with HIV (GNP+), and the International Community of Women Living with HIV (ICW). Supported by a grant from ViiV Healthcare, the survey aims to gauge the overall health and wellbeing of people living with HIV.

The initial findings released November 30, 2018, are the first to be announced from the survey. They include global (N=4,330), as well as city read-outs from five Fast-Track Cities: Bangkok (Thailand), Durban (South Africa), Madrid (Spain), Miami (USA), and Salvador (Brazil):
