

# Impact of pediatric one stop service on child retention in care and treatment

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# Methodology

A 33-day and 12-month retention analysis of 4 health facilities was performed, based on data from June 2018 and June 2019:

- 2 health facilities that implement the pediatric one-stop shop ( Alto- Maé and 1 de Maio);
- 2 health units that provide care for children and adults in the same offices.

Both started 2 years ago.

# Implementing pediatric one-stop shop health facilities profile

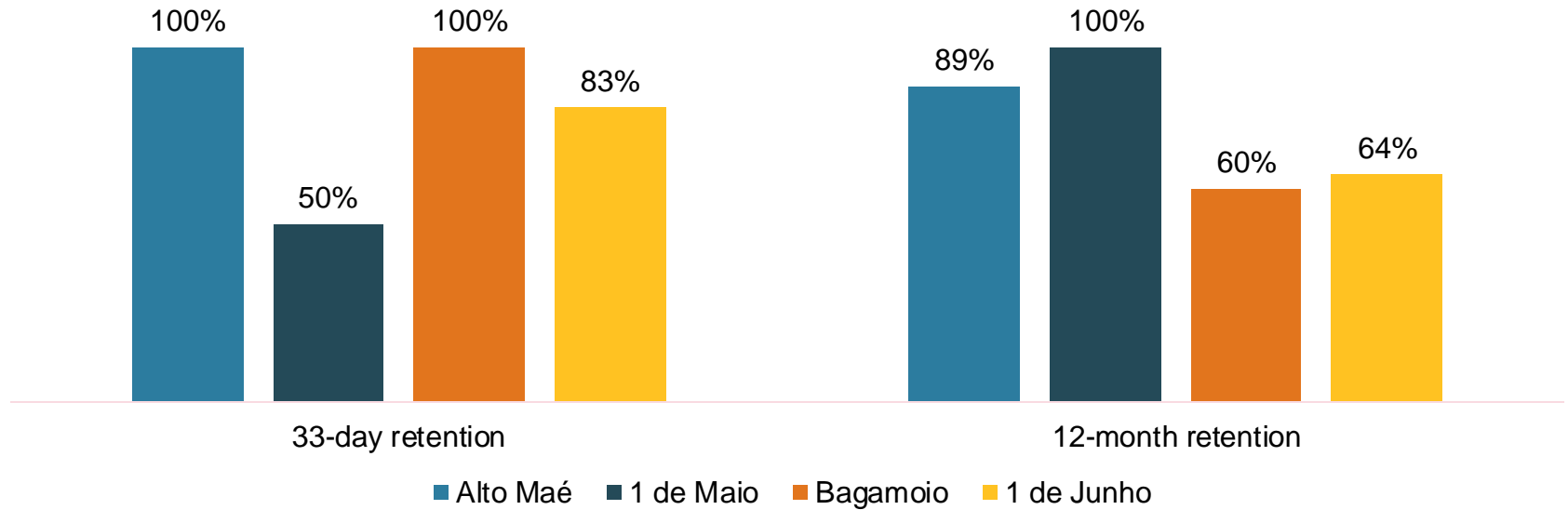
Who is followed at the one stop pediatrics?

- All children in the health facility (except those who are already fully revealed for the diagnosis and have started sexual activity, if the health facility offers specific friendly services to young people);
- Family members and caregivers of children also receiving antiretroviral treatment.

Pediatric one stop model:

- Has no specific impact on early retention;
- Improves 12 month retention ( ~20-30%).
