Dear Colleagues:

These two days in Rome offer an excellent opportunity for discussion, debate, and networking, as we collectively work to improve the prevention, care, and treatment services delivered to people affected by HIV. We will focus also on the role of nursing leadership in ensuring these services are of the highest quality, and ways nurses can be best prepared and informed for their role.

We know you all bring much expertise and experience to enhance the quality of this conference, and we also anticipate that what you take away will help promote and maximise best practices in your own clinical settings.
