We are proud to host this conference in partnership with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) and the Fast-Track Cities Institute, and in collaboration with the Stop TB Partnership and the World Hepatitis Alliance.

Encouragingly, Fast-Track Cities have also taken on the challenge of eliminating HIV and intersectional stigma, which is a public health threat on par with the human immunodeficiency virus itself.

Our calculus for success requires three key elements: political will and commitment, community engagement and leadership, data-driven and equity-based health planning, and high quality clinical and psychosocial care and social support. We thus proudly welcome you as the elected officials, public health leaders, clinical and service providers, and representatives from affected communities who are implementing the calculus for success. We hope that the next three days of conference will help to guide us in our ongoing efforts to end urban HIV and TB epidemics and eliminate HBV and HCV by 2030.

INTRODUCTION

Fast-Track Cities 2022 will be the third in-person gathering of cities and municipalities that are accelerating their responses to HIV, tuberculosis (TB), and viral hepatitis – three diseases cited as urban health priorities in the New Urban Agenda as well as the Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities.

The conference is organized by the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC), in collaboration with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) and the Fast-Track Cities Institute.

The *Fast-Track Cities 2022* conference's aim is to:

- highlight successes achieved across the Fast-Track Cities network,
- address cross-cutting challenges to accelerating HIV, TB, and viral hepatitis responses, and
- share best practices in urban HIV, TB, and viral hepatitis responses.

Building upon the successes of the past three global gatherings of the Fast-Track Cities network, this year's conference will provide space for interactive dialogue to support a network of "connected cities," facilitating the collaborative development of innovative approaches to attaining the goals, objectives, and targets to which all Fast-Track Cities are committed.

The conference features plenary sessions, panel discussions, oral abstract and e-poster presentations, and city and municipal case studies. In partnership with the Stop TB Partnership and the World Hepatitis Alliance, the conference will also feature topics related to ending the HIV and TB epidemics and eliminating HBV and HCV.

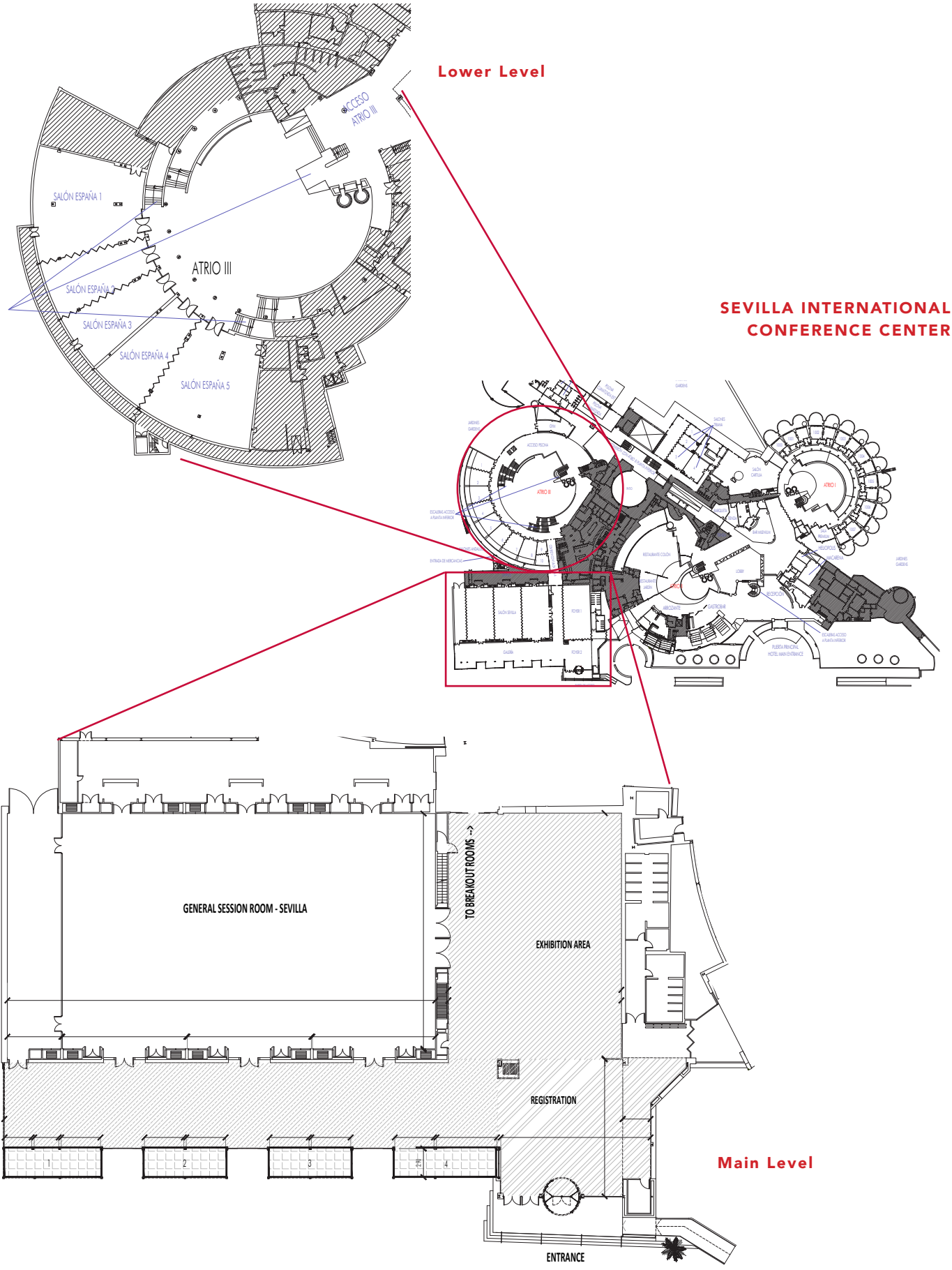
