We are proud to host this conference in partnership with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) and the Fast-Track Cities Institute, and in collaboration with the Stop TB Partnership and the World Hepatitis Alliance.

Encouragingly, Fast-Track Cities have also taken on the challenge of eliminating HIV and intersectional stigma, which is a public health threat on par with the human immunodeficiency virus itself.

Our calculus for success requires three key elements: political will and commitment, community engagement and leadership, data-driven and equity-based health planning, and high quality clinical and psychosocial care and social support. We thus proudly welcome you as the elected officials, public health leaders, clinical and service providers, and representatives from affected communities who are implementing the calculus for success. We hope that the next three days of conference will help to guide us in our ongoing efforts to end urban HIV and TB epidemics and eliminate HBV and HCV by 2030.

Fast-Track Cities 2022 will be the third in-person gathering of cities and municipalities that are accelerating their responses to HIV, tuberculosis (TB), and viral hepatitis – three diseases cited as urban health priorities in the New Urban Agenda as well as the Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities.

The conference is organized by the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC), in collaboration with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) and the Fast-Track Cities Institute.

The Fast-Track Cities 2022 conference's aim is to:

- highlight successes achieved across the Fast-Track Cities network,
- address cross-cutting challenges to accelerating HIV, TB, and viral hepatitis responses, and
- share best practices in urban HIV, TB, and viral hepatitis responses.


