Dear Esteemed Delegates,

It is my great pleasure to welcome you to the Fast-Track Cities 2023 conference in the dynamic city of Amsterdam. With more than 700 delegates representing over 250 cities from around the world, this fourth in-person conference is a gathering of global significance as the Fast-Track Cities network actions global goals locally for maximum impact in the fight against HIV, tuberculosis (TB), and viral hepatitis.

INTRODUCTION

Fast-Track Cities 2023 is the fourth in-person gathering of cities and municipalities that are accelerating their responses to HIV, tuberculosis (TB), and viral hepatitis – three diseases cited as urban health priorities in the New Urban Agenda as well as the Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities Ending the HIV Epidemic.

The conference is organized by the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC), in collaboration with the Fast-Track Cities Institute (FTCI), Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), and GGD Amsterdam.

The conference aims to highlight successes achieved across the Fast-Track Cities network, address cross-cutting challenges faced by local stakeholders, and share best practices in accelerating urban HIV, TB, and HCV responses.

The conference also provides a space for interactive dialogue and facilitates collaborative engagement around innovative approaches to ending urban HIV and TB epidemics, as well as achieving HCV elimination.

As in past years, the conference features a distinguished faculty from across the Fast-Track Cities network, convened under the theme, “Integration and Inclusion for Impact.” The theme reflects the importance of an integrated approach to urban HIV, TB, and viral hepatitis responses that prioritizes inclusion to realize the rights to dignity, health, and wellbeing.

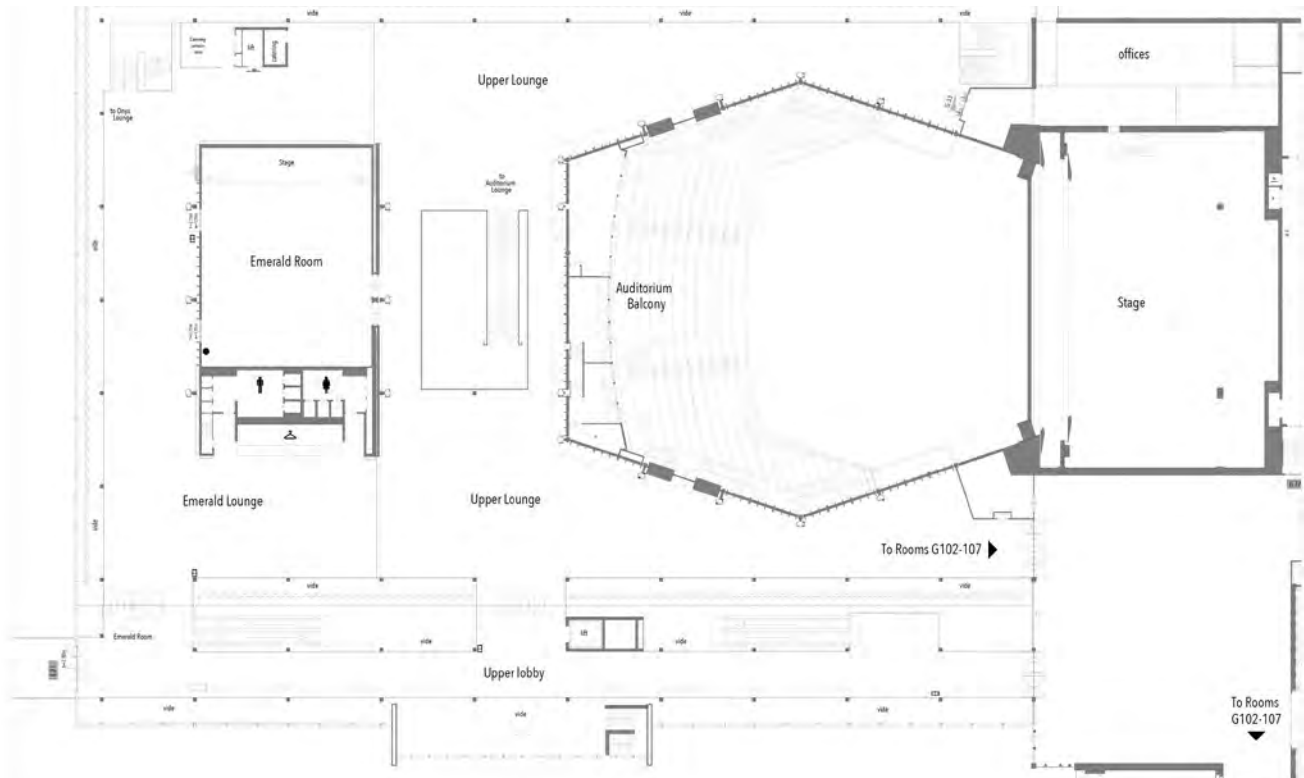

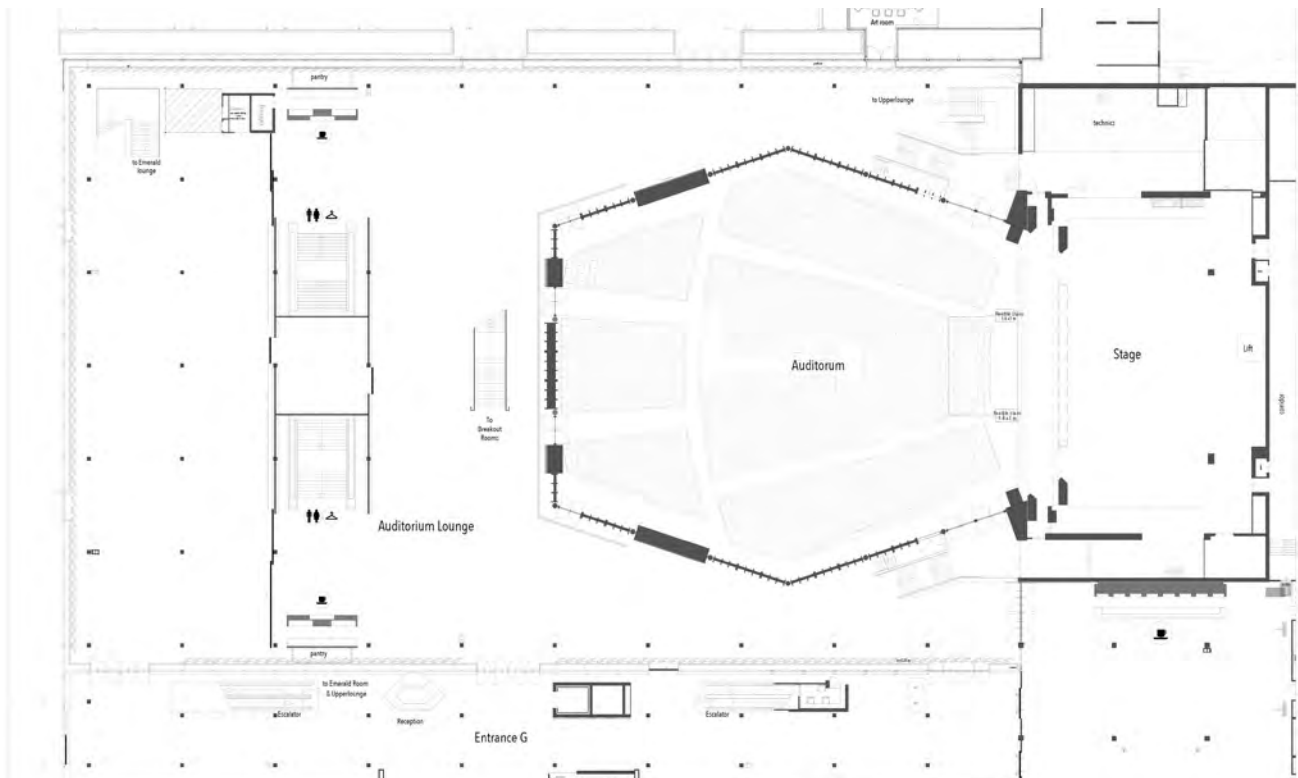
CONFERENCE VENUE MAPS
