Preamble

- ➤ We, the undersigned stakeholders participating in the US Fast-Track Cities 2025 Summit in New Orleans, and those across the US Fast-Track Cities network, reaffirm our dedication to ending urban HIV epidemics in line with the **Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities Ending the HIV Epidemic**.
- ➤ At a moment when political and financial headwinds threaten to reverse hard-won gains, we gather in solidarity to declare that US cities and counties will persist in our efforts. We recognize that local leadership, community partnership, and data-driven accountability remain essential to sustaining momentum toward the goal of ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030.
- > This New Orleans Resolution articulates our shared values and our commitments to action.



Our Shared Values

- ➤ **Equity:** We believe that no individual should be left behind due to race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, or geography.
- > **Solidarity:** We stand with people living with HIV, affected communities, and local partners to advance inclusive, community-driven responses.
- > Resilience: We commit to protecting the progress achieved, adapting to shifting political and financial landscapes, and safeguarding our local responses.
- ➤ **Accountability:** We pledge to use data transparently to drive decisions, monitor progress, and ensure communities can hold leaders to account.
- > Dignity: We affirm the inherent dignity of every person, combating HIV-related stigma at all levels.



Our Commitments

- > Sustain Political Will: We will continue to press local, state, and federal leaders to maintain HIV as a public health priority despite political change.
- ➤ **Protect Resources:** We will advocate for and leverage diverse funding streams to safeguard HIV services and prevent disruption of care and prevention.
- > Strengthen Community Partnerships: We will ensure the central role of people living with HIV and affected communities in shaping, implementing, and evaluating responses.
- ➤ Advance Integrated, Person-Centered Care: We will link HIV responses to broader health and social services, including mental health, housing, and primary care, recognizing the full spectrum of human needs.
- > Combat Stigma: We will dismantle HIV-related stigma in all its forms and promote U=U.

➤ By signing the **New Orleans Resolution**, local stakeholders across the Fast-Track Cities and counties network affirm our shared values and commit to these actions. In unity, we will not allow political or financial headwinds to deter our mission.
