Loss of surveillance capacity



Increased HIV/STI incidence due to loss of prevention/testing



Workforce reductions & CBO contract terminations



Collapse of harm reduction (SSPs, PrEP access, outreach programs)



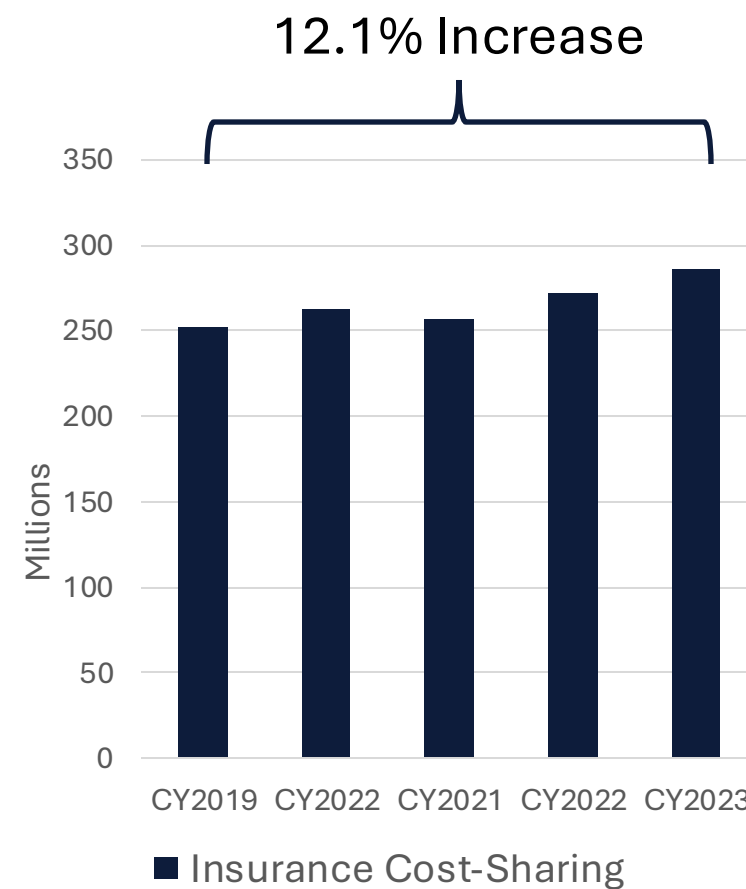
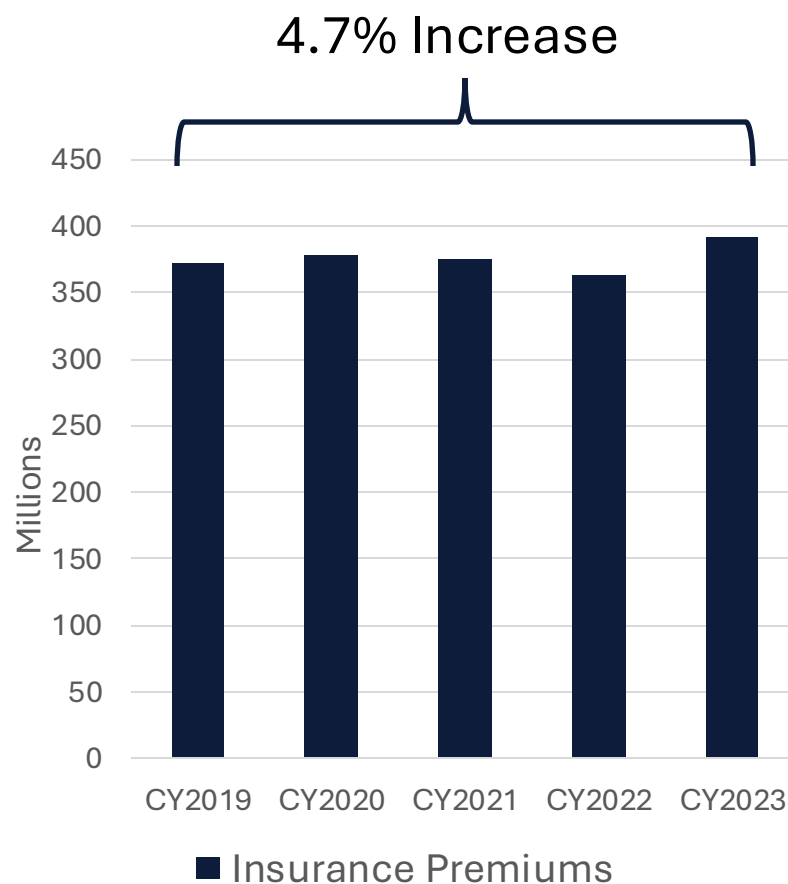
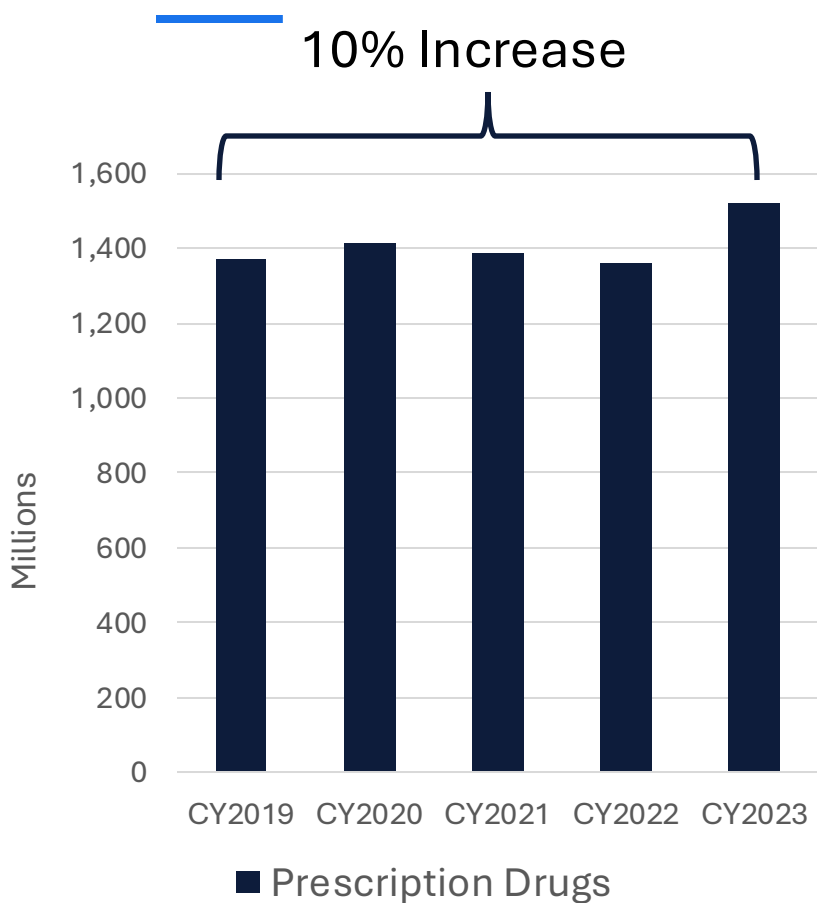

# Impacts on Ryan White Part B/ADAP

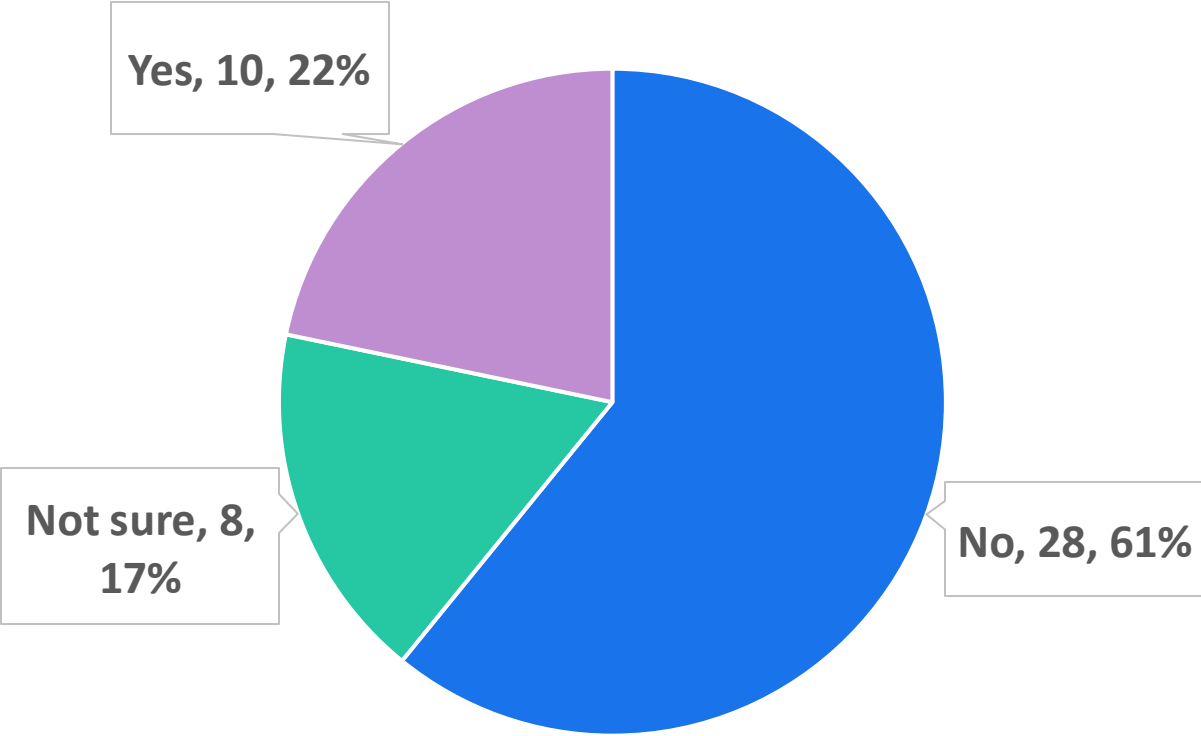
- Unprecedented influx of new and returning RWHAP clients
- Significant uptick in uninsured clients requiring access to, and continuation of, HIV prevention and viral hepatitis services
- Swelling of ADAP full-pay programs and increased insurance support and expenditures
- Increased financial burden among safety net programs relying heavily on Medicaid reimbursements
- Continued flat-funding for RWHAP Part B and ADAP should be anticipated
- Greater allocations of Part B base and supplemental to ADAP, retention of rebates by ADAPs likely to be necessary
  - Will impact funds available for RWHAP Part B services
- Increased need for state contributions to ADAP budget
- Austerity/cost-containment measures



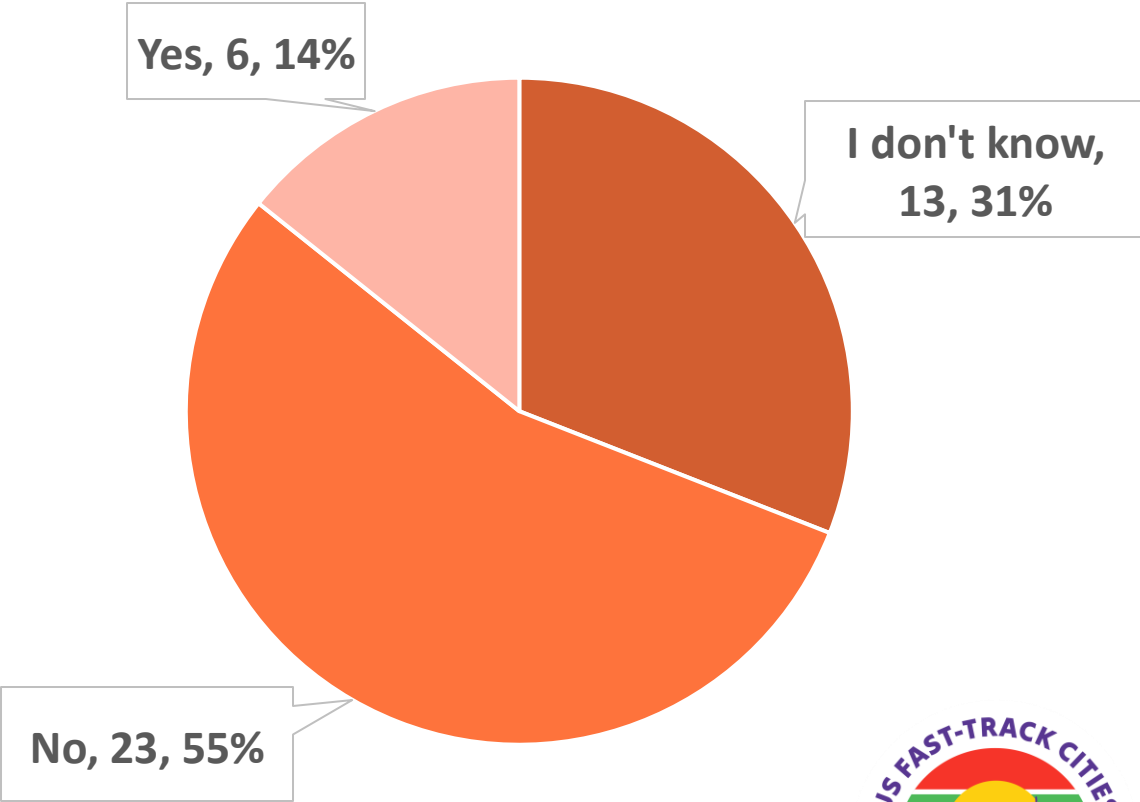
# ADAP Expenditures (44 States/Territories)



Did recent federal staffing reductions (e.g., Reductions in Force affecting federally assigned or field-based staff) impact your program(s)?



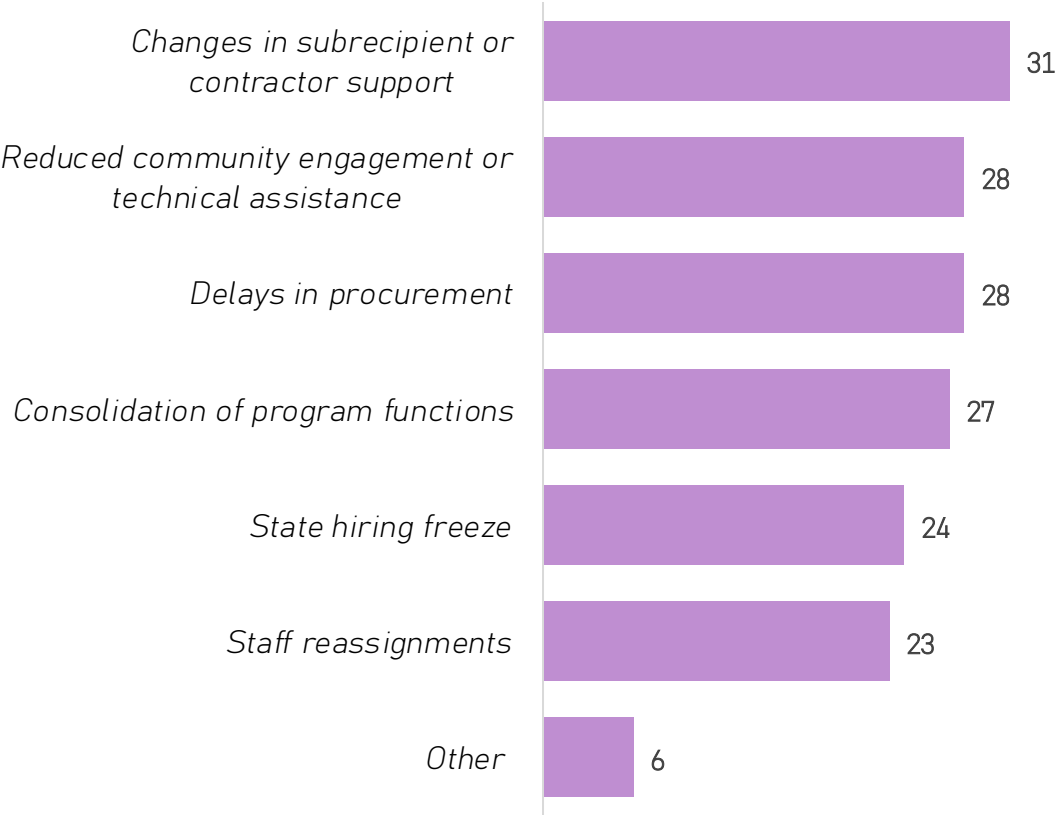
Were any staff restored with the changes in CDC's Reduction in Force?
