

BACKGROUND



HIV Epi – New Orleans

- Black trans women ages 13 to 34 in the South half of all cases among TGD (Trans and Gender-Diverse People)
- HIV incidence for Trans Masc higher than national average
- Testing among TGD may be lower than GB cisMSM (Gay/Bisexual Cisgender MSM)




Other TGD (transmasc nonbinary genderfluid)







HIV Epi – New Orleans



Risk Factors

- Trans men and TGD AFAB
 - Condomless front hole and anal sex with cis men
 - Testosterone + vaginal tissue increases HIV risk
- Similar sexual risk behaviors for binary and non-binary TGD people
- Infrequent/never testing

Research Questions

- 1. What are HIV testing perceptions and experiences among Black TGD in New Orleans?
- 2. What do Black TGD recommend for promoting HIV testing among other Black TGD?






METHODS



Participants

Inclusion

- 18-34
- Condomless sex past 12 months
- GNO resident




Recruitment (2021-2023)

- Bars and clubs
- CBOs
- Social media
- Snowball sampling
- Former CARES participants








Qualitative Methods

- Virtual 1-on-1 semi-structured interviews
- Black TGD Interviewers
- \$50



Socio-ecological Framework

- Deductive and inductive coding
- Regular meetings consensus and resolve discrepancies



RESULTS



Participant Characteristics

- n=12
- Ages 19-34 (mean=24)
- 75% tested ≥ 2x per year
- 25% trans fem, 17% trans masc





Recommendations


- Access and instrumental support
